

It has now been over four weeks since my aortic valve replacement surgery. During that time VNA Care nurses and physical therapists have visited on a regular basis to monitor my progress, watch out for any unusual developments, and generally support my recuperation. My sister has been with me throughout, generously providing care and assistance that have been altogether indispensable. As the weeks pass, I have felt stronger, become steadier on my feet, and been able to sustain more activity at one time. I am comfortable and free of pain. But I am still under many surgery-related restrictions and have to take things slowly. Fatigue remains quick to assert itself even after the slightest exertion.

The road ahead, then, is likely to be longer than I would prefer, and will certainly call for patience and keeping expectations modest. The next major milestone is a post -op check-up at the hospital in early March. If all is well, I will be cleared to drive and to return to the parishes. But we shall see.

In the meantime, many thanks to everyone for your concern, cards, messages on Caring Bridge, and prayerful accompaniment. I miss everyone, and look forward to the day when I will be among you once again.

LENTEN GUIDELINES 2017

The annual observance of Lent—Ash Wednesday through the Mass of the Lord's supper on Holy Thursday—is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its twofold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent prepares us to celebrate the paschal mystery.

Abstinence -- Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be used at all.

Fasting -- Catholics ages 18–60 years are bound to the obligation of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.
